The May 1st, 2021 General Election

Applications for Councilmember will be available during the filing dates, January 13, 2021 until February 12, 2021. You can pick up the application packet at the River Oaks City Hall or it will be posted on the website www.riveroakstx.com. All applications MUST be completed and turned in by 5:00pm on February 12, 2021.

QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFICE:

Each person who becomes a candidate for Mayor or councilmember shall meet the following qualifications:

1. be at least twenty-one (21) years of age on the date of the election or date of appointment;
2. be a citizen of the United States;
3. be a qualified vote[r] of the city;
4. reside and have resided for at least twelve (12) months preceding the election day within the corporate limits of the city;
5. no candidate may file for more than one office or position number per election.
6. Not have been convicted of a felony for which he or she has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities .
7. Not have been deemed mentally incompetent by a final judgement of court.
8. Also, you must be able to attend council meetings 2 times a month at 7:00pm, attend special council meetings and budget meetings.

Residential Sewer Rate Averaging December Through February

Each year the City of River Oaks averages the water consumption of the December, January, and February billing periods to recalculate sewer charges. These months are used because typically residents do not have a high outdoor water demand and are considered to be the lowest overall water use.

The new winter sewer average goes into effect on the April billing and that will be the new monthly sewer charge for the next twelve months.

Did you know that one leaky faucet dripping at the rate of one drip per second can waste more than 3,000 gallons per year? With the winter sewer billing season upon us, now is the time to seek out those leaks and get them fixed before you lose more than just water down the drain.

These factors could contribute to a higher than normal bill:

- ◆ Toilets that don't shut off or run occasionally.
- ◆ Dripping faucets.
- ◆ Furnace humidifiers set on high, which uses water each time the furnace runs.
- ◆ Outside faucets that are not shutting off completely. Sprinklers system that have not been properly winterized to prevent freezing and bursting.
- ◆ Faulty water heaters and valves.
